In 2022, we highlighted the Environment while in the prior year we chose Civic Education.

Our emphasis on the endowment model is meant to signal that we are in this for the long run. Consequently the initiatives that were begun in the prior year continued into 2022. AYITI COMMUNITY TRUST

is a transnational community foundation that supports innovation in Ayiti through grantmaking and community activation.

ASSET-FRAMING APPROACH

The people of Ayiti are the country's greatest asset. We, at Ayiti Community Trust, believe that Ayiti and its people are more than the challenges that we face.

As a transnational community foundation, we operate within an asset framework that views the people of Ayiti assets. When we focus on the collective strengths and aspirations, we build solutions to Ayiti's challenges that benefit all of its people.

COMMUNITY **DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK**

A development initiative that provides control of the development process. resources, and decision-making authority directly to groups in the community.

Operate on the principles of transparency, participation, accountability, and enhanced local capacity.

INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS

Novel solution to a problem that is more effective and sustainable.

Innovation typically involves digging deep to learn about the root causes of a challenge. Working together with the people experiencing the challenge is very important. As an example, instead of donating food to the food bank, social innovators would work with the people

that access the food bank and together test out different ideas to increase their income or make food more affordable. It is a trans-disciplinary concept increasingly applied to a range of fields with the goal of removing barriers to participation in society, reducing inequalities, and promoting integration, inclusion, and justice.

OUR MISSION

To support and sustain development innovation in Ayiti (Haiti) in the areas of civic education, environment, and entrepreneurship.

OUR PILLARS



ENTREPRENEURSHIP

This strategic focus on economic livelihood enables us to support business innovations that help stabilize the local economy and cultivate a new generation of entrepreneurs.



ENVIRONMENT

This year, our pillar of focus was the Environment. We hosted an Environment Forum that connected grassroots organizations from across the country that are leading the way in climate-resilient solutions and building a dedicated national network of innovators.



CIVIC EDUCATION

Our grantee partners help lead their communities to become civic -engaged members of society. They provided education on civic duty, along with many leadership development programs for youth, women, and girls.



2022 GRANTEES:

BASKETBALL POU ANKADRE LAJENÈS (BAL)

organization Mission: BAL uses basketball as a tool to educate and mentor vulnerable Haitian youth. In addition to basketball, participants partake in a wide variety of educational and enrichment activities designed to maximize their capacity as citizens and keep them out of trouble. BAL operates in two of Port-au-Prince's most underserved urban neighborhoods: Cité Soleil

and Martissant.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE: BAL proposes to use ACT funding to launch a citizenship program that will catalyze a new generation of youth citizen-leaders. Participants will receive innovative training in civic education and community service that will help them grow into agents of change for a new Ayiti. A portion of the awarded funds will also be used to cover the organization's operating costs.

SOLDARITÉ HAITIENNE POUR LE DÉVELOPEMENT DE KENSCOFF (SOHADERK)

ORGANIZATION MISSION: SOHADERK works to reverse the environmental degradation of natural resources in the mountainous community of Kenscoff. They provide agricultural extension services and innovative training to a growing network of farmers in the region and Martissant.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE: SOHADERK will

train its network of farmers on the use of biofertilizer and biopesticides in order promote sustainable agricultural practices that protect the environment, increase farmer incomes, and yield more nutritious foods. This will serve as a demonstration project that could be expanded to new communities across Ayiti whose livelihoods are dependent on agriculture and a thriving natural environment.

COOPÉRATIVE DES ACTEURS DE PÊCHE D'ENVIRONNEMENT ET D'ÉLEVAGE (CAPEELAG)

ORGANIZATION MISSION: CAPEELAG

is a cooperative of fishermen and local associations on the island of La Gonave

working to protect coastal ecosystems that are critical to their livelihoods and well-being.

an essential component of the coastal ecosystem. They provide habitats for high-value marine species, prevent coastal erosion and storm surges, and sequester 10x more carbon than terrestrial trees. However, the cutting of mangroves for use in charcoal production has threatened their existence. CAPELAG proposes to combat this trend by rehabilitating La Gonave's mangrove forests and establishing a community goat park to generate new sources of income that can help offset charcoal production money.

ACTION TOWARD INITIATIVES AND VOLUNTEERING FOR EDUCATION IN HAITI (ACTIVEH)

ORGANIZATION MISSION: ACTIVEH

harnesses the passion and potential of students as a force for positive change. They help youth channel their energies toward professional internship placements and good-will community service projects in Ayiti.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE: With funding support from ACT, ACTIVEH will enhance its existing programming in several key domains:




